



23 Days to the Keystone Charter Election—Please Vote

Keystone is Colorado's newest town.

In March, Keystone Voted:

- To become a Town**
- To become a Home Rule Town with a Charter.**

VOTE on September 26th to approve the proposed Home Rule Charter, written by nine Commissioners, elected by Keystone's voters.

Why Become a Home Rule Town?

APPROVING the Charter to become a **Home Rule Town** gives Keystone the **flexibility** to form a government **tailored to Keystone's needs including: electing and establishing a town government; and, regulating taxation, zoning, and growth.** The Charter frees Keystone from statutory rule, the default, boiler plate model.

What will a Home Rule Town look like?

- USPS eligibility for a **Keystone zip code** and a **Keystone post office!** The Dillon Postmaster has investigated and initiated the process to establish a Keystone zip code, and post office. **This is only possible if the Charter passes.**
- A Town **Government tailored to Keystone's needs**, responsive to the entire Keystone Community, dedicated to solving Keystone's issues today and shaping Keystone's future.
- Keystone-centered planning and approval of future growth ensuring **parking, traffic and trails are addressed in future developments and current issues are fixed**
- The ability to access **future revenue does not place additional burdens on property owners and residents.**
- A **professional town manager** appointed by the Town Council, and small staff to carry out day-to-day operations **focused only on Keystone's needs.**

NOTE: If the Charter fails, The Town of Keystone will default to a Statutory model, which puts Keystone at the mercy of legislators in Denver, and the one-size-fits-all Colorado statutes, depriving Keystone of the flexibility it deserves to shape and control its future.
